CERTIFICATION

The ACF has a comprehensive certification program open to chefs, cooks, bakers, culinary educators and administrators offering 14 different designation levels. Professional development classes are offered on line at www.acfchefs.org, and at regional and national conferences.

For each certification level, ACF verifies quality of work experience, education enrichment, and professional activities including 30 hours of course work in sanitation, nutrition, and supervision. Over 21,000 certifications have been awarded since 1973. Some of the levels are:
